Big Exeter Feast success!



More than 80 people from Exeter's VCSE sector and local food businesses attended the Big Exeter Feast to explore how food can be made more accessible, affordable, healthier, sustainable and celebrated in Exeter. Only 2% of locally grown food is sold directly into Exeter and 35% more people are using Exeter Food Bank than last year, The sell-out conference, organised by Exeter Community Initiatives'

Exeter Connect project discussed what an integrated and eco-food system in Exeter might look like, and what partnerships and local groups and organisations can do to turn the vision into a reality.

Lots of amazing ideas came out the conference and the hope is partnerships can be formed to create a city food system in Exeter that works in partnership to make healthy and sustainable food a defining characteristic of where people live.
